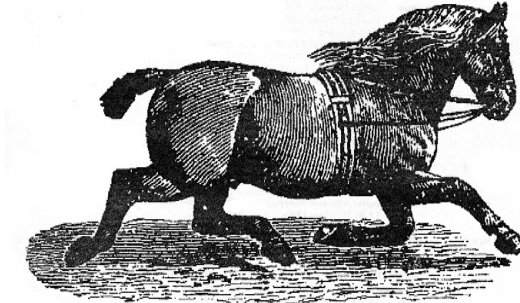

## **ENTRIES, FEES AND PARKING**

All entries £18.00 Entry fee includes a contribution for First Aid services.

Late entries for all Light Horse classes will be accepted at an additional £2.00 (i.e. £20.00) both before and on the day up to one hour before published time of class.

Entries before the day close at 6pm on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2024. All entries received after this will be classed as late entries.

All entries for Suffolk Horses need to have been received by the show secretary by April 20th 2024 – NO late entries (except for Young handlers)

Cars accompanying competitors in lorries, park in the lorry park at their own risk, at a charge of £10.00 per car, payable at the gate.

Members are entitled to free entry with parking in the forward area. Disabled parking is in the forward area. General public entry is £5.00 per adult, children free with free car parking in the allotted area.

### **CUPS and TROPHIES: Cup winners are requested to enter the Grand Parade.**

For reasons of security, the Woodbridge Horse Show Committee would prefer to retain all trophies and cups after presentation and will undertake the engraving as appropriate, for a small charge, payable in advance. Competitors will be able to have a photograph of themselves taken with the cup or trophy.

### **Rosettes to 6<sup>th</sup> place will be presented (unless otherwise stated)**

**HARD HATS: Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. All PAS015, VG1, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. British Showjumping helmet guidelines can be found at British Showjumping Rule 101. Classes 85 and 90 allow Adult riders only, to wear alternative riding hats entirely at their own risk.**

## **AFFILIATIONS**

**Equifest qualifiers:** The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant Equifest Championship class to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire 1<sup>st</sup> – 4th August 2025.

**UK Ponies and Horses.** 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed competitors in the appropriate classes will qualify for the UK Ponies & Horses Spring Classic 2025, to take place at Onley Grounds Equestrian Centre in Warwickshire. Qualification Cards are not handed out in the ring, however results can be verified by the office. Competitors in qualifying positions are not required to become members of UK Ponies & Horses to compete at the Spring Classic.

### **British Skewbald & Piebald Association**

This show has qualifiers for the BSPA Championships 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2024. All classes will be judged within the rules and criteria of the BSPA. Copies of the Rule book and Membership / Horse Registration / Overstamping Forms can be obtained from the Show Office: 01354 638226 or may be downloaded from: [www.bsponline.com](http://www.bsponline.com). BSPA Classes are open to Members and Non-Members but only Members will qualify for the WCC Championships.

In order to qualify, all Owners / Handlers / Riders must be Members of the BSPA and all Horses / Ponies registered with the BSPA prior to the Show. BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the Ring and signed by the Judge, otherwise the qualification is invalid.

All stallions 4 years old and over must be graded, licensed and registered with the BSPA or in possession of a 2024 Stallion Showing Permit in order to compete and must carry into the ring their Red BSPA ID Card and Stallion Bridle Discs to be worn. (Contact the BSPA for Stallion Showing Permit information).

### **Senior Showing and Dressage Limited (SSADL)**

SSADL Home Produced Qualifiers are OPEN to both Members and Non-Members of SSADL No Spurs with the exception to senior side saddle riders, No Galloping or canter extensions, No Wearing of Face/Body Jewellery with the exception to the ear ring used by competitors with health problems. Foals are NOT permitted SSADL Classes. For In-Hand Classes- Minimum age of handler = 11 years old. First Ridden ponies/riders will be asked after the initial walk round to come into the centre of the ring. First Ridden Competitors will only canter in their individual shows. Lead Rein Riders: If a strip section is required a lead rein rider MUST stay mounted.

STALLIONS- Either for In Hand or Ridden classes, Competitors Must be 16 years of age or over.

Competitors cannot enter the ring once the command of trot has been given. The same rider/handler/pony/horse combination must stay the same from qualifier to Grand Finals, unless special circumstances should arise, then it will be left to the discretion of the Directors and Advisory Committee to oversee this rule if required.

**2024 Qualification System: SSADL Members will receive their own qualification card. This is to be signed in the at time of judging/presentation. This is the members responsibility to ensure the right qualifier is signed for.**

1. 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> in each age group will qualify for the London International Horse Show 2<sup>nd</sup> round qualifiers 2024
2. 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> from each AGE section will qualify for the SSADL  
**Members Open Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted) Open to all types and Breeds.**  
**Members Mountain and Moorland Challenge. (Lead Rein Ponies are NOT permitted)**  
**Members Foreign Breeds Challenge.**
3. **The 6 highest placed Lead/or First Ridden Members Lead Rein/First Ridden Challenge**
4. 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> in each age group will qualify for the **Senior of Year Championship**

(If a competitor has already qualified the qualification can be passed down the line). Once a member has filled their qualification card to the relevant classes then said card must be sent into the Office by normal post by 30<sup>th</sup> August 2024 . REMEMBER TO PHOTOCOPY YOUR CARD.

**Non – Members Qualification cards will be handed out in the ring to the two highest placed competitors in each section these are for Non-Members ONLY**

Qualification cards MUST be returned to SSADL Head Office within the 10-day period of date of show along with a 2024 Membership application completed and payment made. Once a qualification card/membership is sent in correctly along with payment only **then** will Members be eligible for the Members Challenge Preliminary rounds and Challenge Finals to be held at the SSADL National Championship Show on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2024 at Onley Grounds, Rugby, Warwickshire. Please make a copy of your card and **do not** send recorded delivery

This show is affiliated to the Suffolk Horse Society (SHS) and classes 1-16 are qualifiers with championship points for annually awarded trophies and for the Supreme Suffolk Horse Championship.

All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix.

All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book.  
All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion license number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a license is pending but not yet issued.

**Woodbridge Horse show is delighted to support this class and will generously be paying the additional fee due to HOYs for each competitor. The competitor will therefore just have to pay the standard entry fee due.**

This competition is open to purebred Suffolk Horse mares, geldings and stallions 4 years old or over, that are registered in the main British Stud Book of the Suffolk Horse Society, to be ridden. Partbreds are not eligible to compete. All Riders and Owners must be Members of The Suffolk Horse Society.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This class will be run in accordance with the British Ridden Heavy Horse Society however the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook will take precedence, a copy of which can be downloaded from [www.hoys.co.uk](http://www.hoys.co.uk).

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest conformation mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Member and Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

**Class 92 Best Horse or Pony Ridden Side Saddle**

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. The Highest placed coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16rs or over (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

To be shown in any suitable bridle. Riders not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.  
Qualifier for the Equifest Mountain and Moorland First Ridden Championship and UK Ponies and Horses Lead Rein Gold Medal Series
- Class 127 Ridden, stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, registered in their respective pure breed society stud book of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland or Welsh A & B.** Rider any age.

### **PRIVATE DRIVING**

All driving classes are open to animals 4 years old and over, driven to suitable vehicles. Each turnout must have a competent adult groom/passenger in attendance at all times. There will be no road drive. BDS rules appertaining to young drivers and also the wearing of hard hats will apply.

- Class 150 Novice Turnout**  
Combination not to have won a first prize at the BDS annual or a county show prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> 2024. Open to any vehicle excluding Hackney/Welsh cob show wagons or trade vehicles
- Class 151 Pleasure driving.**  
This class is for newcomers to showing, not those who show in private driving classes. Open to horses, ponies, donkeys and mules, singles, pairs and tandem. The vehicle must be capable of seating two or more persons. Traditional and non-traditional vehicles are permitted. To be judged on:  
15% vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness  
15% harness suitability, fit and cleanliness  
70% driver, groom, horse/pony way of going and suitability of family pleasure animal.  
Competitors may be asked to do specific movements as directed by the judge.

**NOTE:** In the event of a clash between dressage times and other classes, the Dressage Steward must be informed in advance or competitors may be disqualified.

### **DOG AGILITY CLASSES**

If you are bringing your dog with you to Woodbridge Horse show why not have a go at our **FUN** Dog Agility Course. Help and encouragement will be offered and if you don't have a dog with you, but would still like a go then please ask as we may be able to hire you a friendly dog at a little extra charge. Agility Equipment is provided courtesy of *Paws of Parham Dog Agility Club*.

Running from 10am-12pm and 1-3pm. Rosettes will be awarded at 3pm.

There will be a charge for each go – all funds are going to be donated to a Charity nominated by the organisers of the dog agility classes and will be specified on the day.

**LOST CHILDREN: Children who become separated from their parents or carers should be taken immediately to the Woodbridge Horse Show Secretary's office and a Woodbridge Horse Show Committee member present informed.**

### **BYE LAWS**

1. All Suffolk horses must be entered under the registered name of the bona fide owner or be hired by the exhibitor. All Suffolk horses must be from Suffolk parents registered in the UK Suffolk Horse Society Stud Book. Pedigree section.
2. All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. All foals must be eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. Both the sire and the dam must be registered and entered in the pedigree section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion licence number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a licence is pending but not yet issued.
3. No stallion may be exhibited unless wearing full stallion harness. Every stallion must be safely restrained while he is on the Showground and the decision of the Show Director in the matter of the handling of stallions will be final.
4. Nomination entries for Suffolk Horses will not be accepted.
5. Prize schedules and entry forms may be obtained from the Secretary and no horse will be entered until such a form is received by the Entries Secretary and fees paid.
6. That fees for the entry be received the Secretary on or before 1st April 2023 as shown in this schedule and entries received after that date and on the day will be at a fee to be decided annually by the Show Committee. No late entries for Suffolk horses. Entry fees are not returnable. If, however, the Society shall refuse an entry, cancel a class or classes or the Show, entry fees may be refunded at the discretion of the Council. It may refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted without giving any reason for doing so and reserves the right to refuse entries from any person who is under exclusion or suspension by any breed, livestock or show organisation. Any fees refunded shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society.



7. The public will be admitted to the showground at rates to be decided annually by the Show Committee. Car parking is free. Cars accompanying lorries may park in the Lorry Park at their own risk, at a cost of £10 per car, payable at the gate.
8. The decision of the judges is final and they will be instructed not to award a prize in classes in which the animals exhibited do not possess sufficient merit.
9. Servants in charge of stock shall be subject to the orders of the Show Director and Stewards of the Show.
10. Standing in a turnout vehicle by any person either while the vehicle is stationary or while it is being driven is not permitted on the Showground. Vehicles must be driven from either a sitting position or from the ground.
11. Any exhibitor shall be liable to forfeit £100 if any animal sent by him shall be labouring under an infectious or contagious disease.
12. In all cases of dispute a protest in writing, accompanied by a deposit of £5, shall be delivered to the Secretary before the close of the Show, otherwise the protest cannot be entertained. The Secretary shall immediately give notice of the protest to the Director and Chairman of the Show and the Stewards concerned, who shall if possible decide the case before the conclusion of the Show. Otherwise it will be referred to the Committee. In either case, the decision shall be final. The deposit of £5 shall be forfeited to the Society. When a protest is considered, all parties to the dispute shall be notified.
13. The Society, its Officers or Servants will not be responsible for, or accountable to, any person whatsoever for any damage or loss to the property of any person whatsoever or for any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise, or for any disease, damage or loss that may occur to any person whilst upon the Showground or car parks or whilst entering or leaving the same. The Society, its Officers or Servants shall not in any way be responsible or accountable for any accident, loss or damage that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents, or to any exhibit or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the Society's Show. Exhibitors or their servants or agents shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by them and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings, claims and costs arising therefrom. Exhibitors or their servants or agents should always be satisfied that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. Exhibitors must insure against fire and other appropriate risks not only as regards their own property but also in respect of any third party claim.
14. If a competitor enters two classes and times of the events clash, the competitor may claim a refund of the entry fee in respect of the class not participated in.
15. HARD HATS: Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. All PAS015,VG1, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted.
16. 'Go Pros' or other similar recording or camera devices must not be worn by exhibitors whilst on the showground and must not be mounted on either animals or equipment.
17. All cups and trophies for competition which are presented by or through the Woodbridge Horse Show Society are perpetual and will be held by the winner for one year only. Copies of the Rules and Regulations may be obtained from the Secretary.
